Seminar To Address Important Issue of Personal Finance Management

Theodore R. Daniels, founder and president of the Society for Financial Education and Professional Development (SFEPD), will conduct a seminar on personal financial management, from 5:30-7:30 p.m. Thursday, September 2, at the Southern University Law Center.

SFEPD is a non-profit organization whose mission is to enhance the level of financial and economic literacy of individuals and households in the United States and to promote professional development at the early stages of career development through mid-level management.

The free two-hour seminar will be in 130 A.A. Lenoir Hall and is open to the public. It will include such topics as debt reduction, re-payment of student loans, financial independence, and wealth building.

“There are many reasons why a good financial management seminar can be helpful to not only law students, but the general public,” law professor Arthur Stallworth said.

The Louisiana State Bar authorities use credit history as one criterion in assessing character and fitness for bar admission, he said. “Employers are reviewing applicants’ credit worthiness in deciding whether or not to offer a position.”

Co-sponsors of the seminar are the SULC Budgetball Initiative, the Path to Financial Independence Project, funded by the W. K. Kellogg Foundation, and the SULC Business Law Society.
