History

ON DECEMBER 16, 1946, IN RESPONSE TO A LAWSUIT BY AN AFRICAN-AMERICAN RESIDENT SEEKING TO ATTEND LAW SCHOOL AT A STATE INSTITUTION, THE LOUISIANA STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TOOK “POSITIVE STEPS TO ESTABLISH A LAW SCHOOL FOR NEGROES AT SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY...TO BE IN OPERATION FOR THE 1947-1948 SESSION.”

PLANS FOR THE LAW SCHOOL WERE APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION AT ITS JANUARY 10, 1947, MEETING. ON JUNE 14, 1947, THE BOARD OF LIQUIDATION OF STATE DEBT APPROPRIATED \$40,000 FOR THE OPERATION OF THE SCHOOL. THE SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY LAW SCHOOL WAS OFFICIALLY OPENED IN SEPTEMBER 1947 TO PROVIDE LEGAL EDUCATION FOR AFRICAN-AMERICAN STUDENTS.

SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY LAW CENTER GRADUATES, BEGINNING WITH THE LEGENDARY CIVIL RIGHTS ATTORNEY, POLITICAL LEADER, AND EDUCATOR JESSE N. STONE, JR., ALVIN BASILE JONES, LEROY WHITE, ELLYSON FREDRICK DYSON, AND ALEX LOUIS PITCHER OF THE CLASS OF 1950, HAVE SPREAD ACROSS THE STATE AND NATION AS TRAILBLAZERS IN THE LEGAL PROFESSION, SECURING EQUAL RIGHTS FOR OTHERS. TO DATE, THE LAW CENTER HAS MORE THAN 5,000 GRADUATES AND IS ONE OF THE NATION’S MOST RACIALLY DIVERSE LAW SCHOOLS.

AFTER 38 YEARS OF OPERATION AS A SCHOOL OF LAW, THE SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RE-DESIGNATED THE SCHOOL AS THE SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY LAW CENTER, ENHANCING ITS IMAGE IN THE REGION AND THE NATION. THE LAW CENTER STRESSES LEGAL EDUCATION OF HIGH QUALITY FOR STUDENTS FROM DIVERSE BACKGROUNDS.

Meet the Chancellor

ALVIN R. WASHINGTON



Alvin R. Washington currently serves as the Chancellor at the Southern University Law Center. Before this role, he was the managing professor for the law center's mediation clinic. He has taught various subjects, including Torts, Legal Research, Statutory Analysis, Alternate Dispute Resolution, and Legal Negotiations. Additionally, Washington has been an adjunct professor at the Southern University Graduate School, instructing in conflict resolution courses.

As a registered civil and family law mediator with the Louisiana State Bar Association, Washington has mediated hundreds of cases. He has been appointed by the United States Eastern and Middle District Courts to mediate hurricane-related claims. He has also mediated cases for the USDA, the Louisiana Department of Justice, the EEOC, and the Baton Rouge Family Court. Furthermore, he has served

as an arbitrator for the Better Business Bureau and the Baton Rouge City Court.

Washington earned his undergraduate degree from Grambling State University and his Juris Doctor from Southern University Law Center. After law school, he served as a Naval JAG officer in Long Beach, California; as a military trial lawyer; and as Department Head for the Claims Division of the United States Navy. He was also appointed as a special assistant to the United States Attorney General for the Central District of California. Following his military service, he returned to Louisiana and worked as an assistant attorney general with the Louisiana Department of Justice handling general liability, road hazards, and civil rights cases.

Before joining the Southern University Law Center in 2003, Washington served as the Section Chief of the Civil Rights Division at the Louisiana Department of Justice for four years. Engaged in the community, he has been actively involved in organizations such as the 100 Black Men of Metro Baton Rouge, Baton Rouge Chamber of Commerce, Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, and Baton Rouge Branch NAACP. His contributions have been recognized with the Century Club Award for pro bono legal services and the Pillar Award from the Southern University Law Center's National Lawyers Guild.

Commencement Speaker

HONORABLE RONALD C. GATHE, JR.



Ronald C. Gathe Jr. is a career prosecutor with a reputation for being a remarkable trial attorney. In 2021, he was nominated by President Joseph R. Biden and unanimously confirmed by the United States Senate as United States Attorney for the Middle District of Louisiana. He was the first black U. S. Attorney for the Middle District of Louisiana. As the chief federal law enforcement official in the district, Mr. Gathe was responsible for enforcing federal criminal laws with his federal partners such as FBI, ATF, DEA, Secret Service,

IRS, HSI, U.S. Marshalls and a host of others. In addition, he managed the district's Public Safety Partnership program along with community organizations, state and local law enforcement, and government officials to optimize coordination and encourage partnership in keeping the district safe. Under his leadership, he improved his office's conviction rate to an outstanding 92% underscoring the importance of fair and firm prosecution with quality cases.

Additionally, he represented the U.S. government in civil proceedings where he had authority to settle claims up to \$10 million dollars. Of the \$9,712,626.45 initially demanded in civil claims under his authority, only \$1,996,740.68 were paid in settlements saving \$7,715,885.77 in taxpayer money. As U.S. Attorney, Mr. Gathe reported to Attorney General Merrick Garland as part of his Advisory Committees on the issues Civil Rights, Voting Rights, Human Trafficking, Foreign and Domestic Terrorism, and National Security. U.S. Attorney Gathe requested a designated civil rights attorney for his office which he was awarded and led investigations into the pattern and practices of Louisiana Department of Corrections alleged over-detention of detainees and the patterns and practices of Louisiana State Police. His duties also included serving as the Executive Director for the National Center of Disaster Fraud and on the Gulf Coast's High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area Committee. As U.S. Attorney, Mr. Gathe served nine parishes having a population over one million people.

Commencement Speaker

HONORABLE RONALD C. GATHE, JR.

Previously, he served as the Chief of Trials for the 18th Judicial District, Office of the District Attorney under the Honorable Tony Clayton, where he was responsible for training the assistant district attorneys and supervising all trials held in the district which encompasses West Baton Rouge, Pointe Coupee, and Iberville Parishes. Also, Mr. Gathe was the first black Section Chief for the 19th Judicial District, Office of the District Attorney under the Honorable Hillar C. Moore, where he was responsible for prosecuting a broad range of felony crimes including homicides, rapes, robberies, and other crimes of violence. He started his prosecution career as an assistant district attorney under the Honorable Doug Moreau.

Mr. Gathe is a native of Baton Rouge where he attended St. Francis Xavier School and Catholic High of Baton Rouge. He received his Bachelor of Science in Accounting from Xavier University of Louisiana and his Juris Doctor from Southern University Law Center with the Class of 2000. Upon graduating from law school, he worked as a Judicial Law Clerk for the Honorable James Best in the 18th Judicial District. Mr. Gathe has also served as an Adjunct Professor at Southern University Law Center where he taught Criminal Procedure, Criminal Law and Trial Advocacy. He was also the district attorney's office liaison and prosecutorial

supervisor over the Southern University Law Center Externship program. In 2016, Mr. Gathe was awarded the honor of Distinguished Alumni at Southern University Law Center.

Mr. Gathe served as the first President of the Louisiana Chapter of National Black Prosecutors Association; the first chapter chartered in the State. Under his tenure, the Louisiana Chapter was awarded Chapter of the Year and established a pipeline of Black prosecutors across numerous parishes within the State. He has also served the organization on a national level serving as Regional Director, Vice President of Membership, and Treasurer of the National Black Prosecutors Association. He was acknowledged by the National Black Prosecutors Association at the National Convention for having 15 years of experience as a prosecutor. He also received the NBPA President Special Recognition Award. He is now a 2025 SULC Hall of Famer and currently serves as Senior Special Prosecutor for the 18th JDC District Attorney's Office.
