I. Policy Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to inform Southern University Law Center (SULC) faculty and students of the grading scale used in law school courses which are not designated pass/fail courses. The policy also identifies courses that are pass/fail at the Law Center.

II. Policy Scope

This policy applies to faculty and students.

III. Policy Compliance

This policy informs individuals of the grading scale used in SULC courses which are not pass/fail.

IV. Policy Definitions

Not applicable.

V. Policy Development and Implementation Procedure

The policy was created by the SULC faculty to establish the grading scale to be used in all SULC courses which are not pass/fail courses. The Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs will be charged with implementing and enforcing this policy.

VI. Policy and Applicable Procedures

A. The following grading scale is to be used in all SULC courses that are not designated pass/fail courses. If a course is designated a pass/fail course, then a student can only earn either a letter grade of "P" for passing the course or "F" for failing the course. In all other courses, the following grading scale is to be used:

Nonetheless, nothing in this policy should be read as preventing a professor from awarding grades based on a curve or a similarly accepted method of adjusting their grades based on the academic performance of their students. It is herein acknowledged that grades resulting from the application of a curve or similarly accepted method of adjusting grades may not conform to the above listed grade scale.

Additionally, a professor teaching a course that has not been designated a pass/fail course cannot issue a grade of pass (P) but must award a grade listed on the grade scale (A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, C-, D+, D, D-, or F).

C. Any newly created co-curricular course or intervention course will be a pass/fail course, unless designated differently when the faculty approves the creation of the course.

VII. Policy History and Review

This policy was created and became effective prior to the implementation of the uniform policy format which was implemented in 2019. On May 28, 2021, the policy was reviewed and updated by placing it in the uniform policy format. On February 11, 2022, the policy was updated to include language allowing professors to use a curve or similar method of adjusting grades and clarifying the grades that can be awarded in a class that is not designated as a pass/fail course. The policy was updated, on February 24, 2025, to identify the pass/fail courses at the Law Center. The policy is subject to a five-year policy review cycle and shall be reviewed by the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and any changes will be submitted to the faculty for consideration.
